

Can a believer commit the unpardonable sin? ¹

Think on this....

Either it is Eternal life or it is temp. life. John 3:16 1 John 5:13 John 14:1-6
If it is eternal life then it is eternal and that is forever. If it is forever then you can not lose it.

We may be sure that those who indeed repent and believe the gospel, have not committed this sin, or any other of the same kind; for repentance and faith are the special gifts of God, which he would not bestow on any man, if he were determined never to pardon him; and those who fear they have committed this sin, give a good sign that they have not. The trembling, contrite sinner, has the witness in himself that this is not his case.

Once you have drawn your last breath and you enter into the Spiritual side of eternity, then its too late.

Can a Believer Commit the Unforgivable Sin?

No. A believer cannot commit the unforgivable sin. Think on these 3 things:

- (1) How can someone who has been born again (John 3:7),
- (2) made a new creation (2 Cor. 5:17),
- (3) and received eternal life (John 10:27-28) actually commit the unforgivable sin? They can not cause they have passed from death to life.

A true believe in Christ cannot commit the unforgivable sin. Jesus Himself said that we have eternal life, not conditional life: "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me; and I give eternal life to them, and they shall never perish; and no one shall snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:27-28). Besides, it says in 2 Cor. 5:17 that the Christian is a new creation in Christ. We are different, no longer slaves to the old nature (Rom. 6:14). We are regenerated by the Holy Spirit.

There is no biblical support for a believer committing this sin. It just hasn't happened. Also, if you are worried that you may have committed the sin and can't be forgiven, then don't be concerned. If you are worrying about it, then you haven't committed it. If you are worried about it, then that is a sign that you have not committed it. If you had, you wouldn't be concerned nor would you even care. Your spirit would be dead to His Spirit (to Him)..... You would have NO conviction nor concern. You would be dead to God and in return God would be dead to you. He would honor your request.... You want a world without God.... Then God gives those who say... GOD LEAVE US ALONE... and He does. Forever, in this life and the life to come.

Can a believer commit the unpardonable sin? ²

(John 8:44 KJV) Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.

Those who have not received Jesus are still under the authority of the father of all sin because of Adam and Even when they conceived sin, rebellion against God then they inherited the father of all sins (Satan) inheritance... eternal damnation.

Read the ROMANS ROAD AGAIN. Read Romans chapters 4-8

(John 5:24 KJV) Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.

John 5 Verses 24-29. Our Lord declared his authority and character, as the Messiah. The time was come when the dead should hear his voice, as the Son of God, and live. Our Lord first refers to his raising those who were dead in sin, to newness of life, by the power of the Spirit, and then to his raising the dead in their graves. The office of Judge of all men, can only be exercised by one who has all knowledge, and almighty power. May we believe His testimony; thus our faith and hope will be in God, and we shall not come into condemnation. And may His voice reach the hearts of those dead in sin; that they may do works meet for repentance, and prepare for the solemn day.

(1 John 3:14 KJV) We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death.

If you have ever meet someone who has no concern, nor any desire to know Christ, or totally hates the thought of God... chances are they may have committed that sin and the H.S. will no longer deal with their heart. God hardened Pharos's heart since Pharo did not want the God of Israel. In other words, God's H.S. never dealt with him about salvation after he had chosen over and over to ignore God and to NOT accept God as his God.

That is why we read (2 Cor 6:2 KJV) (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)
